Mike Arnett of Lifestyle Homes seems to have been destined for the building trade. A second-generation homebuilder, Arnett worked for his father through college doing everything from carpentry to construction supervision to project management. But after studying advertising and PR at the University of Oregon, Arnett struck out on his own, moving to Chicago and a Fortune 500 firm to put his degree to use.

“I learned a lot about being a small-volume custom builder from my family, but I didn’t think I wanted to do that. I was always listening to my dad talk and asking questions, but that was my dad’s job. But after five years in advertising, I wasn’t finding the motivation that I’d had in the beginning,” said Arnett.

Returning home to Portland, Arnett started Lifestyle Homes and became a certified Master Builder. Over the past three decades, the custom homebuilder has won acclaim, awards, and respect in the industry for high-quality craftsmanship and outstanding collaboration with clients.

Arnett, who was also named COBA’s Volunteer of the Year, is excited to advocate for the local building industry as president.

“The community of builders here are tremendous people. At COBA, we have members to take care of and promote. We want to showcase building in different areas and price ranges. Obviously we want to foster the building industry in Central Oregon and address the myriad issues we face: the transportation bond, for example. Fire hardening—the state is wanting us to take a look at our building codes to avoid the kind of mass destruction that’s happened in California. Energy-efficiency codes. The new zoning codes that went into effect this year. Work on single-family zones to increase the clearly needed housing supply. Land supply, labor, materials, planning, zoning—COBA does a great job of taking the pulse of all those issues and we look forward to working with local government this election year,” Arnett said.
